

Bin the Butt!

We have received complaints from our neighbours about cigarette butts being dropped around the boundaries of the school site.

As a school, we support the Bin the <u>Butt</u> campaign, especially as their research has shown that cigarette butts can take years to breakdown. Worse still they never fully biodegrade and are toxic to the marine environment because cigarette filters are comprised of thousands of chemical ingredients, including arsenic, lead and nicotine, all of which can leak into marine environments. According to studies, just one cigarette butt per litre of water is highly toxic to fish.

Please be considerate – smoking and vaping are not allowed in Combs Ford Primary School buildings, grounds, car parks, or in vehicles parked in the school car park.

Measles

You may have seen news of a measles outbreak in parts of the country. Measles is an infection that spreads very easily and can cause serious problems in some people. Having the MMR vaccine is the best way to prevent it.

Safer Internet Day 2024

Safer Internet Day 2024 is on Tuesday 6th February. We will be marking this in school with activities and an assembly. The theme is "Inspiring Change? Making a difference, managing influence and navigating change online." The UK Safer Internet Centre has created a range of pages to help you talk about these issues and ideas with your child, no matter how much time you have and in an age-appropriate way which you can find on their <u>Parents and Carers</u> page.

There's also information to support you on the school's <u>Online Safety</u> web page. <u>Vodafone's Digital Parenting Website</u> is also full of useful information.

Each app your child uses will have an age rating – you can find out what these are by searching sites like the <u>NSPCC</u>. Most of the well-known social media sites have a minimum age of 13+ years, but you should check the age rating of individual apps to make sure. WhatsApp, for example, has an age rating of 16+. We recommend that children should not have their own Social Media accounts until they reach the minimum age.





Volunteer Readers

We are looking for volunteer readers to hear our children read. You will need to be available on the same afternoon every week and, to comply with Keeping Children Safe in Education, will need to provide two references and agree to undergo criminal record checking (DBS).

Attendance Reminder



95%: 10 days absence a year = 50 hours of learning lost

These children are less likely to achieve their target grades and will start to find it difficult to maintain a habit of attending school regularly. Children who take a 2 week term-time holiday every year can only achieve 95% attendance.

Above 97%: Less than 6 days absence a year = less than 30 hours of learning lost

Excellent attendance! These children will almost certainly get the best grades they can, leading to better prospects for the future. Children will also get into a habit of attending school which will help in the future.

90%: 19 days absence a year = 95 hours of learning lost

The Government classes children in this group as "Persistent Absentees", and it will be almost impossible to keep up with work and achieve their target grades. Parents of children in this group could also face the possibility of legal action being taken by Suffolk County Council, including the issuing of Penalty Notices and Fines.
